Before applying for scholarships, you need to know which ones you're eligible for. The steps below will help you narrow down your search and provide links to the scholarship applications.

1. Review recommended scholarships

The Learning Abroad Center (LAC) recommends a number of scholarships, listed at UMabroad.umn.edu/students/finances/ scholarships/recommended.

All University of Minnesota (UofM) students going on a UofM sponsored program are eligible for the Study Abroad Scholarship, but you should also dig deeper to see which other scholarships can help fund your experience abroad.

2. Consider additional opportunities

Use the UofM's Study Abroad Scholarship Search (web-app.gps.umn.edu/lacfunding) to find additional scholarship and funding opportunities available to you.

3. Attend an info session

At our popular You CAN Afford to Study Abroad info session, you'll get an overview and tools that will help you choose a program and apply for scholarships and financial aid—all important parts of making your dream of studying abroad a reality.

4. Seek out essay-writing tips

Learn how to write an effective personal statement from the UofM National & Internships Scholarship Advising Office (honors.umn.edu/scholarships).

Schedule an online or in-person appointment to get your scholarship application reviewed by the UofM Center for Writing (writing. umn.edu).

FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid (loans and grants) can make a difference in your ability to study abroad.

What to know about financial aid

- Financial aid is available for credit-bearing experiences abroad.
- Most financial aid, including state and federal loans and grants, can be applied toward study abroad.
- Even if you have not received aid in the past, consider applying for financial aid for the academic year you plan to go abroad.

Basic steps for acquiring financial aid

- Complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- If you plan to use federal financial aid, arrange a financial aid preview meeting with the Office of Student Finance at One Stop—612.624.1111.

SCHOLARSHIPS Are there many scholarships available for study abroad?

Yes. There is significant financial support available for study abroad. Most scholarships will not fund an entire program but can help reduce the financial burden.

- University of Minnesota (UofM) students are eligible for \$1.5 million dollars in UofM study abroad scholarships.
- Many program providers offer discounts and scholarships for UofM students.

What is important to know about applying for scholarships?

- Many scholarships are awarded based on the quality of an essay rather than financial need or academic merit.
- You are eligible to receive multiple scholarship awards, so plan to apply for several.
- In most cases, you do not have to be accepted into a program before applying for scholarships but should have a program in mind.
